
A list of funded trainings and seminars run by SALTO, Erasmus+ NAs and NGOs in the youth field

NEET's work is based on the need for more discussion around the issue of unemployment-related social exclusion in Europe. The project aims to reach youth workers with unexplored opportunities, young foreigners or young people with less opportunity,

NEET's work is based on the need for more discussion around the issue of unemployment-related social exclusion in Europe. The project aims to reach youth workers with unexplored opportunities, young foreigners or young people with less opportunity, NEETs. We encourage youth workers with untapped opportunities to reach the target audience because we believe that all people, especially youth in NEET situations, have the skills and desire to move forward in their lives, and we will encourage and support these NEET people a little more. A third of young people in Europe are NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Education) and youth organizations can play a minor role in policies to reduce this rate. The training course also aims to create a network of youth organizations dealing with youth unemployment. We want to use non-formal education to approach unemployment among marginalized youth.

## Erasmus+

Erasmus+ is the European funding programme for education, youth and sport. The programme creates opportunities for everyone to continue to develop. Lifelong learning. To ensure that internationalisation becomes part of **policy and practice**, Erasmus+ offers subsidy opportunities within action lines:

### Mobility

Professionalisation of staff takes an organisation further. That is why, as a professional, you can learn or work abroad for a maximum of two months. For example: jobshadowing. Mobility is also available for youngsters.

### Cooperation partnerships

As an organisation, you and your colleagues would like to broaden your horizons. This can be done by entering into a cooperation partnership with other organisations abroad and jointly develop innovative new materials.

## Usually

- \* 5-8 project partners
- \* 3 to 6 countries
- \* Mix of types of partners

## Practical information

- Who can participate: any organisation active in the field of education;
- Number: minimum of 3 organisations from three different programme countries;
- Duration: one to three years;
- Budget: a maximum of EUR 400.000 per project per year.

## What can a cooperation partnership lead to?

- innovation and improvement in educational & youth work ;
- More coherence between education, youth work, government and business;
- more interaction in practice, research and policy.

## Example of a successful project proposal

### WEEKENDSCHOOL (2022-2025)

Setting up a weekendschool job orientation programme to contribute to reducing inequality of opportunity for children and young people across Europe

#### Success factors/ pitfalls:

- Strong description of **needs** for the project.
- Right **mix** of partners.
- Focus on **implementation**, teacher & student exchange, and development
- First EU project by project leader, proposal dev. Support and project management by experienced **support partner**
- **Resilience**: project approved at second attempt
- Pitfall: **commitment** by a few partners

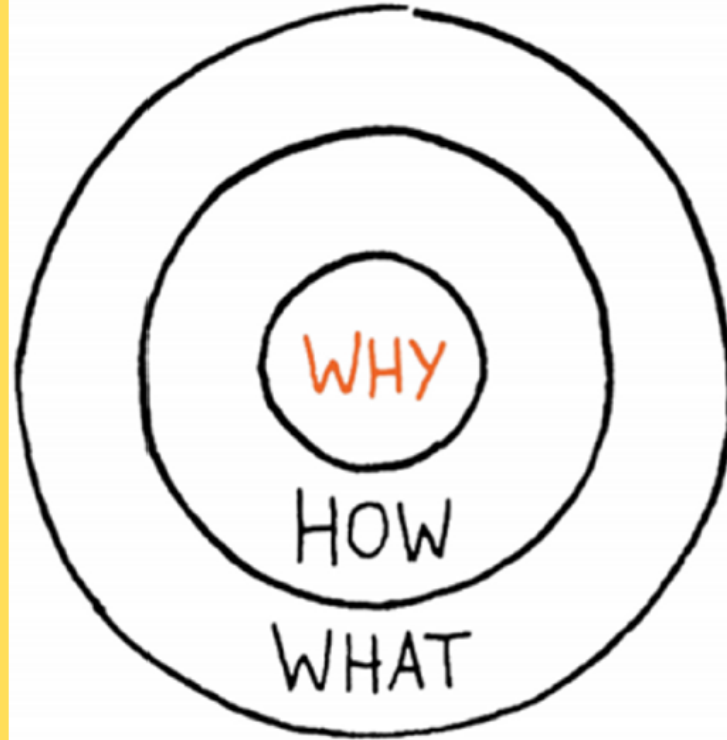
